Important Information- Graduation Day


- Thursday, May 27th -10:45 a.m. dismissal (transportation will be provided)
 - Students must be in attendance on Thursday, May 27th to participate in graduation. This is also the last day of attendance for 8th grade in-person students.
- Graduates must report to PHJH no later than 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 27th.
- All graduate personal belongings should be left with a parent/guardian (purses, cell phones, etc.,).
- All graduates must have appropriate attire underneath the cap & gown.

Important Information- Graduation Day

- Balloons, Flowers, whistles, horns or any other items deemed a distraction will not be allowed on campus during the ceremony. Please leave any gifts in your vehicle to be presented after the ceremony.



A Special Note for Parents and Graduates
