# **Navigating the Kahoot! platform**

First things first, let's recap what Kahoot! is - it's a game-based learning platform for any subject, in any language, on any device, for all ages. It was designed to make learning fun, and was built on three founding principles - Social, Play and Learn.

In this section, we'll show you the way around Kahoot! To get started, log into your Kahoot! account. You'll immediately land on our **Discover** page.




### **Discover page**

There are tens of millions of public kahoots created by our us, our users, and our partners - on all topics, for all grades, age levels and contexts.

All kahoots are categorized into various collections. For example, there are regularly refreshed collections for **Top picks, Trending,** and **Trivia.** 

You can play any existing kahoot, duplicate and edit it before you play, or create a completely new kahoot from scratch.



We also have hundreds of curriculum-aligned, readyto-play games in our Kahoot! Studio collections.

Our **Kahoot! Studio** collections cover core subject areas such as:

- ▶ Math
- ▶ ELA (English Language Arts)
- ▶ Science
- ▶ History & Social Studies
- ▶ Computer Science

They fully align to curriculum standards such as:

- ▶ Common Core
- ▶ TEKS
- ▶ NGSS
- ⊳ IB



## How to duplicate, edit, and share kahoots

With millions of public kahoots on our platform, it's easy to find a game that's relevant to what you're looking for. However, what if it needs tweaking, personalizing or doesn't quite fit the standard you use? That's where our Duplicate feature comes in!

How to duplicate and edit a kahoot

Click on a kahoot from the Discover page, or Explore

games on our website, to see an overview of all

the questions and preview answer options.


Once you've decided on the kahoot you want to edit, click the 3-dot dropdown next to the kahoot's title, and then hit the **Duplicate** button.

Immediately, you'll be taken to the kahoot draft page. The duplicated kahoot is also auto-saved into **My kahoots.** You'll notice that the title will be prefaced with **Duplicate of...** and the original creator of the kahoot is **always credited**.

From the kahoot draft page, you can edit the title, description, questions, change, remove, or edit answer options, rearrange question order, change the time limits for each question, and add or remove imagery and/or video.

Once the kahoot is tailored to your needs, hit **Save**, and your kahoot will be ready to **Play**, **Preview**, **Challenge** or **Share!** 









To find all the kahoots you've created, navigate to the **Kahoots** button on the top navigation bar.




## My kahoots

On this page you'll not only have an overview of all the kahoots you've ever created yourself - stored in reverse chronological order - but also those you've favorited and those others have shared with you.

On this page, you can directly **Play, Challenge** (for homework - a feature we'll dig into further down the line!), or **Edit** your kahoots.

Click the title of a kahoot to navigate to its overview page. From there, you can also duplicate (i.e. make a copy) the kahoot and edit it - great if you want to tweak a kahoot slightly - or delete a kahoot you no longer need.






How to make your first kahoot

# Step 1: Log in and click Quiz, Jumble, Discussion, or Survey

To create a kahoot, click the **Create** button to navigate to the Create page.



## **Create page**

You have the option to choose from different game types.



#### Quiz

Our most popular, multiple-choice quiz game type - choose from two to four answer alternatives



#### **Jumble**

Put the answers in the correct order - this game type requires a lot of focus



#### Survey


The quiz type with points, this option's perfect for polling, facilitating a discussion, or gathering feedback



# Step 2: Add a description, tags, and cover image

Adding a good description helps you define learning objectives for the game and keep it focused. Using descriptive tags will ensure other teachers can find it easily. A great cover image helps the kahoot stand out and attract more players.





# Step 3: Create the learning game by adding questions, answers, and imagery

Follow the instructions on-screen to add questions, answers, images and video clips. You can also fine-tune the kahoot using different timer and points settings or setting multiple correct answers.



# How to play your first kahoot

Kahoots are best played in a group setting, like a classroom or a conference room - or even with family at home.

Games are displayed on a shared screen. Players join in using their own device –whether that is a smartphone, tablet, or computer doesn't

matter as long as they have a browser and good Internet connection.

## Step 1: Find a game to play

There are millions of public kahoots available on the platform. Search for a game on a relevant topic, or choose a kahoot from the start page. For example, try one of our curriculum-aligned games in math, science, and other subjects.

Or maybe you've created your own kahoot already? Open the kahoot and click **Play.** 

#### **TOP TIP!**

Players don't need an account to play!



# Step 2: Launch the game so players can join

Change the settings if you like (for example, randomize the order of questions, control answer streak bonus, etc) and click on **Classic** or **Team mode** to start letting players in.

A unique Game PIN will be displayed at the top of the screen. Players enter this PIN to join the game in the <u>Kahoot! app</u> for iOS and Android. Alternatively, if they can't install the app on their device, they can join by going to <u>kahoot.it</u> in their browser.

## Step 3: Play the kahoot

Click **Start** once you can see all the players' nicknames on the "lobby" or waiting screen. During gameplay you can use the space bar or your mouse to go to the next question.

At the end of the game, click **Feedback and Results**, and then **Final Results** to save and download the scores, favorite, or play again.


# How to assign a kahoot as homework

In addition to playing live in a group setting, you can also assign kahoots as homework with the challenge feature.

Save time on correcting assignments and make homework really engaging for students. They play homework challenges after class in our <u>mobile</u> <u>app</u>, and you get a neat report with the results.

On your computer, open a kahoot and hit the **Challenge** button. Select when you want the challenge to end, copy the link or the game PIN and share it with your students. For example, via LMS, email, etc. It's possible to challenge players from the mobile app, too: log in to your account, open a kahoot you like, tap **Play** and **Challenge friends.** 

You can also challenge your friends and family with a cool quiz for fun!





After playing a kahoot live in class, or as a homework challenge, all the results and data from the game feed into the **Reports** page.



## Reports

The **Reports** page displays a full list of the results of all kahoots you've ever hosted – either live or as a challenge – in reverse chronological order.

Each kahoot is time-stamped for easy filtering and searching. You can download the results report to Excel or to Google Drive.
