## **Business Department**

*The Business Department is off to a great school year! Our department oversees the financial management of the Prairie-Hills School District 144, including the Annual School Budget, the Tax Levy, Annual Financial Statement and serving on the Construction Management Team.*

*The renovations of the PHSD144 schools continues to go very well. Many of the renovation projects were paid by State and Federal grants, including the Illinois School Maintenance Grant and the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund Grant. Highlights of the construction have included the successful development and opening of the STEAM Academy, upgrades to the interior of Chateaux, renovation of the PLC Kitchen, and upgraded HVAC systems at Highland.*

*As our school year moves forward, construction projects are focused on the completion of the Markham Park expansion & renovation project, upgrading the Mae Jamison partition, renovating the Nob Hill kitchen, the installation of new playgrounds at PLC, and new signs located at all school buildings.*

*For the financial side of D144, we are honored to hold the highest financial recognition from the Illinois State Board of Education. The recognition is based on the district's 1) Fund Balance to Revenue, 2) Expenditure to Revenue Ratio, 3) Days Cash on Hand, 4) Percent of Short-Term Borrowing Ability, and 5) Percent of Long-Term Debt Margin Remaining.*

*The District 144 Business Department is committed to supporting student achievement through efficient financial planning and resource allocation. Our team will remain excellent guardians of tax payer's money; provide open and honest communications which will inform and foster the trust of all stakeholders; comply with all state-mandated protocols and procedures; and design, implement and oversee all budgetary needs for our School District.*



## **Curriculum & Instruction Department** **Dr. Tiffany Burnett, Assistant Superintendent**

*Although the last few years have proven to be challenging, Prairie-Hills ESD #144 remains committed to providing students with opportunities to be successful – academically, emotionally, and socially. We strive to deliver programs and activities to meet the needs of all students. We are delighted that the PHESD #144 After-School Program continues to be offered in all of our elementary school buildings as well as the junior high school. This program has been designed to focus on specific skill deficits identified through assessment data. Students are in intensive remediation sessions tailored to their academic needs in the areas of reading and math. Skills are taught through engaging and interactive hands-on activities.*

*This fall, PHESD #144 began a graphics art after school program at Prairie-Hills Junior High School. The program helps students expand upon their interests in the visual arts, while also creating art that will benefit the school and community. The mission of the program is not only to create art, but to make it more visible around our school and community. PHESD #144 also began an after school Spanish Club at each of our elementary school buildings. The PHESD #144 Spanish Club started with introductory Spanish features such as vocabulary, emotions, numbers, shapes, colors, and simple phrases and progress in difficulty throughout the year. The program is multi-grade, multi-sensory, and uses multimedia. PHESD #144 is gearing up to begin a broadcasting club at the junior high school in winter 2023. The PHJH Broadcasting Club will help students learn communication skills through Morning News broadcasts. Club members will learn how a small media station runs and how to perform in front of an audience and video camera. The students will be able to use their imagination and organization and technical skills to put out a Morning News broadcast.*

*Flag football was the newest addition to the extra-curricular sports activities within the district this fall. Flag football makes football accessible for all children—no matter their age, size, or gender. All of the elementary schools as well as the junior high school had teams that participated in practices and games in September and October of this school year. Another wonderful first this fall was the opening of the new S.T.E.A.M. Academy. S.T.E.A.M. education is an approach to learning that uses science, technology, engineering, the arts and mathematics as access points for guiding student inquiry, dialogue, and critical thinking. This year, the S.T.E.A.M. Academy opened its doors to kindergarten through third grade students, and PHESD #144 looks forward to expanding the program next school year. In addition to the science, math, reading, language arts, and social science curriculum that is covered, S.T.E.A.M. Academy students have the opportunity to participate in art, music, dance, and foreign language classes during the school day. The S.T.E.A.M. Academy was created to foster collaboration; creativity; problem-solving; open-inquiry; experimentation; and communication, all of which impact students'*



social, emotional, and reasoning growth. All of the programs and activities that are taking place within the district this year were designed to provide our students with the best educational experiences possible. We are committed to working with our stakeholders to help all students reach their full potential. Prairie-Hills Elementary School District #144 is pursuing excellence with equity, empathy and empowerment.

This program allows students that are struggling socially and emotionally an opportunity to receive support in a smaller educational setting on our district campus. We are increasing our partnerships with counseling agencies to meet the needs of our students. Our partner, Midwest Family Community Resources provides counseling programs on site at our Prairie Hills Junior High School. We are looking to increase our partnerships to assist more students and families. Currently, we are in discussions with Hartgrove Hospital to expand our support and resources for students and their families.

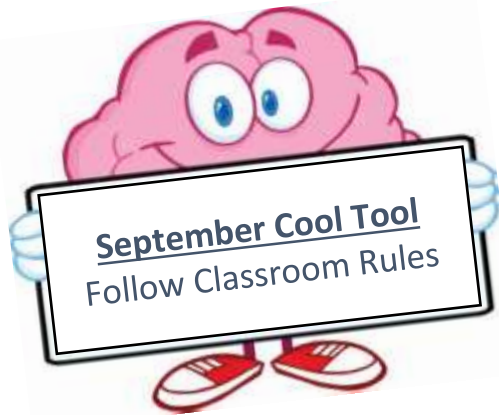
